- For security reasons, all livestock barns will be closed, with no access between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m.. These enforced barn hours will begin on the evening of each market species arrival/check-in day, and continue through the date that each species is transported from the fairgrounds to the processing facility, following the auctions.



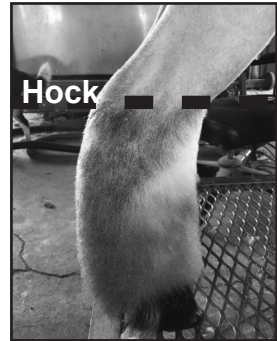

JUNIOR MARKET LAMBS

Rules

1. Exhibitors will be responsible for bringing their lamb from pen to sales ring then back to pen on the day of the auction. Adult assistance will be provided by the Fair, no parent or leader assistance will be permitted in the barn on sale day. Exhibitors are responsible for feeding and watering their animals until they are sold at the Auction.
2. **All lambs must be pre-registered to be eligible at Fair time. Pre-registration does not constitute entry into the Fair. Forms & fees must be completed online by closing deadline.**
3. Tack will be released Saturday, August 5 after 8:00 p.m. Access to water should remain in pens to keep animal hydrated and pens should continue to look presentable through the auction with decorations and educational displays.
4. All exhibitors are eligible to enter showmanship. Weight or judge sifted animals may be exhibited in showmanship class. Sifted stock must be removed at conclusion of showmanship. Pre-entry into showmanship is required. Please see Department 52 for showmanship rules.
5. **The minimum weight for all market lambs is 100 lbs.**
6. After weighing, market lambs will be split into classes within breed in both 4-H and FFA Divisions. Independent Juniors will show with 4-H.
7. **All market lambs must have been “slick shorn” no more than 7 days prior to show time. Market lamb must be “slick shorn” from head to hock.**
8. Shearing must be completed prior to entry on the grounds. Any lambs not meeting these requirements will not be eligible to show or sell. Use of electric clippers are not permitted on the fairgrounds.
9. **Market Animal Fitting: No hair or skin dyes, paints or colorants (including powder), or adhesives are allowed to be used. No products or materials may be used to manipulate the hair on legs. Exhibitors may continue to use oils or clear coat products to enhance shine as well as external applications of substances for appearance to the hoofs. No shadow painting or practices that change the animal's natural appearance.**
10. Use of halters is not permitted with market lambs into the show ring. (Accommodations can be made by contacting the entry office)
11. Muzzling of all animals is prohibited.
12. State Rule IX. Sheep A: To qualify for exhibit, lambs must be docked such that the tail (dock) is healed and can be lifted from the exterior. Lambs that have no dock will not be eligible.
13. When showing market lambs, exhibitor will have one opportunity to set the lamb in stationery position. Lambs front legs may be lifted then immediately lowered so legs remain on the ground at all times.
14. Animals may only be washed in designated wash racks. No washing of livestock within Lyttle Cow Palace.
15. Additional eartags must be removed prior to arrival on the fairgrounds (excluding fair issued, scrapie or other federal ID).
16. The FFA Grand Champion & Reserve Market Lamb as well as 4-H Grand Champion & Reserve Market Lamb will be diverted to official testing area and tested for drug residue, immediately after the judge selects them in the show ring. For more information see Junior Livestock Auction Rules at the beginning of this Department.
17. In addition to complying with all the rules above, **Independent Juniors must also have the following items on file with the fairgrounds Entry Office by June 30, 2023:**
 - proof of grade school enrollment/age
 - full photo of the animal
 - proof of ownership
18. Market lambs will be penned in Lyttle Cow Palace. Lambs will be penned 2 per pen. Please be aware this is a large show and we do our best to accommodate everyone.

Rules

1. One lamb per exhibitor, lamb must be shown by owner.
2. Lamb must have been shown in the Sonoma County Fair Market Show.
3. Pre entry is required. Entry must be submitted online by the close of entries.
4. Open to all exhibitors (4-H, FFA and Independent Juniors).
5. Exhibitors must show in whites only.
6. Animals entered must have been bred in Sonoma County (*animals purchased in Sonoma County but not bred and raised are NOT eligible*). Exhibitor must provide proof of eligibility to fair (*all winners will be verified*).
7. Judges placing is final
8. No weight sifted animals are eligible

Division 3534 – Minor Breeds

(Dorset, Southdown, Shropshire, AOB & Commercial Cross)

1. Lambs will be divided into 2 weight classes (*may change due to entry counts*)

Division 3535 – Major Breeds

(Hampshire, Suffolk, Crossbred and Natural Colored)

Judging Time:	Friday, August 11, 7:00 p.m. 9-13 followed by 14 & up
Commentary:	Each contestant must fill out a commentary sheet, available from the entry office. Bring to the mandatory meeting. Commentaries must be in third person and on Fair issued form.

Rules

1. Age will be determined as of opening day of fair. See class breakdown below.
2. Lead contestants may show any lamb or goat, You do not need to own the sheep/goat used in lead classes.
3. All animals must be conditioned, fitted, and trained to show at halter.
4. You do not need to sew the outfits or costumes. They can be store bought.
5. Entries will be judged on mode of dress selected, which must be appropriate, attractive, lend elegance to the class and safe for the animal.
6. Outfits in Division 3550 must be made of at least 50% wool.
7. Participants must be 2023 Sonoma County Fair junior livestock exhibitors.
8. Entries in these classes will be open to anyone meeting the requirements listed above.
9. The objectives of this division are to represent sheep/goats in the most attractive manner, to give spectators a real opportunity to view a class of beauty and to enhance the image of the Sheep & Goat Industry.
